 - *Usually not recyclable--they often have a non-paper insert or made of a mix of materials including plastic*
- **Cardboard or gift box**
 - *Recyclable-- break it down*

Badger Books

The Village will debut electronic poll books, known as Badger Books, at the February Election. Residents will check-in to vote on a digital monitor as opposed to a printed poll book.

Badger Books will eliminate the need to check-in by ward and reduce waiting times by processing voters on a first come, first serve basis.

In-person absentee voting at Village Hall continues during normal business hours, 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. and will be held through Friday, February 14, 2020 (Village Hall will be open Thursday and Friday until 5 pm for absentee voting.).
